## PRESIDENT BUSH AND CONGRESSMAN ED PASTOR GET TOP BILLING FROM ARIZONA HISPANICS

Phoenix, Arizona, June 19, 2002. Six of ten adults in the Hispanic community give President George W. Bush favorable marks for the job he is dong in office, and applause for the President rises sharply among Latinos in blue collar occupations, those who are men and among those under 35 years of age. In this youngest age set, close to 70 percent give Mr. Bush "good" to "excellent" job ratings.

Not even ten percent believe Mr. Bush is doing a "poor" job as president. Notwithstanding his good scores, Hispanics are 13 points below the general population in their assessment of his job performance

Congressman Ed Pastor is second only to President Bush, with 50 percent rating his performance as "excellent" or "good," a figure that rises to nearly 60 percent among men. Negative assessments of Congressman Pastor's performance are very low (4%). Latinos have a similar appraisal of U.S. Senator John McCain in that 49 percent say he is doing an "excellent" or "good" job and only five percent give him a thumbs down.

Senator Jon Kyl gets lower favorable ratings (29%), but this traces principally to his being far less well known within the Hispanic community rather than to any negative views of his performance. Indeed, only seven percent rate Senator Kyl as doing a "poor" job in Washington.

The findings outlined in this report are based on a survey of 502 Hispanic heads of household across Maricopa and Pima Counties, conducted between April 6 and April 26, 2002, by the Behavior Research Center of Arizona as part of the Center's independent and non-partisan HispanicTRACK<sup>TM</sup>. Governor Jane Hull is generally more favorably viewed by Latinos than by the general public. Thus, among Latinos 43 percent rate her favorably compared to only 37 percent in the general public. On the negative side, the difference is even more dramatic: "poor" job assessments of Governor Hull are twice as high (29%) among the general public than among Latinos (14%).

Finally, State Attorney General Janet Napolitano enjoys job ratings roughly equivalent to those of Senator John McCain: very low "poor" ratings (4%) and favorable ratings of roughly 42 percent.

EDITOR'S NOTE: This report is based on the twenty-fourth semi-annual wave of Behavior Research Center's HispanicTRACK™/Latino Poll survey, completed between April 6th and 26th in 2002, in which interviews were conducted with 502 Hispanic heads of household throughout Pima and Maricopa Counties. Respondents were interviewed in the language of their choice. In a sample of this size, one can say with a 95 percent certainty that the results have a statistical precision of plus or minus 4.4 percent of what they would have been had the entire Hispanic population been surveyed. The Latino Poll is conducted by the Behavior Research Center of Arizona and is an independent and non-partisan research program sponsored by the Center.
