BUSH RATINGS OFF TEN POINTS IN ARIZONA

Phoenix, Arizona, July 24, 2002. President George W. Bush's positive job ratings, although still high by any standard, have dropped a full ten points since April and 16 points since October 2001, after their historic high water mark in the wake of the September 11th terrorist attacks in New York and Washington. Simultaneously, those who view his performance as "poor" rose to 15 percent from ten percent in April and only seven percent in January.

The bi-partisan support enjoyed by President Bush after September 11th is still in evidence, but far weaker today. Thus, while 86 percent of Republicans give the President high marks, only 52 percent of Independents and 42 percent of Democrats agree. Erosion in the President's ratings traces principally to political party affiliation, but is also evident within the ranks of non-Hispanic minority groups, women and in the lowest income segments in Arizona.

The findings outlined in this report are based on a survey of 703 adults across Arizona conducted between July 10th and July 15th, 2002, by the Behavior Research Center of Arizona as part of the Center's independent and non-partisan Rocky Mountain Poll series. This poll also took a look at the image in Arizona of controversial U.S. Attorney General John Ashcroft and found him to be held in high regard by 47 percent of the population, but 25 percent are willing to rate his performance only as "fair," and eleven percent hold the belief he is doing a "poor" job. Views toward Ashcroft are deeply partisan, with 70 percent of Republicans, only 46 percent of Independents and barely 37 percent of Democrats giving him positive job ratings.

Arizonan's views on Senators John McCain and Jon Kyl and Governor Jane Hull remain stable, but reflect mild improvements for Governor Hull.

EDITOR'S NOTE: This Rocky Mountain Poll Arizona (2002-III-03) is based on 703 telephone interviews with adults, conducted from July 10th through July 15th, 2002 throughout Arizona. In the overall sample, one may say with 95 percent certainty that the results have a statistical precision of plus or minus 3.8 percent of what they would have been had the entire adult population been surveyed. The Rocky Mountain Poll is conducted by the Behavior Research Center of Arizona and is an independent and non-partisan research program.
