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## GOP PRIMARIES FOR ATTORNEY GENERAL AND SECRETARY OF STATE

Phoenix, Arizona, July 26, 2002. Even though the primary election is just around the corner, most GOP voters are not yet focused on the Attorney General race in Arizona. However, among Republicans who have made up their minds, candidates John Greene and Foster Robberson appear to have pulled away from Andrew P. Thomas. Greene currently has 13 percent of the vote, Robberson eight percent and Thomas only three percent. Nearly seven in ten remain undecided and nine percent say they will vote for none of the three.

The Secretary of State GOP primary offers a clearer picture and it appears that Jan Brewer has a modest lead, attracting 21 percent of the vote. She is currently trailed by Sal Di Ciccio at 11 percent, and Sharon Collins at seven percent. Half of GOP voters are undecided and another 7 percent say they will vote for none of the three.

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**EDITOR'S NOTE:** This Rocky Mountain Poll Arizona (2002-III-04) is based on 234 interviews conducted with registered Republican voters across Arizona from July 10<sup>th</sup> through July 15<sup>th</sup>, 2002. Where necessary, figures for age, sex and race were weighted to bring them into line with their actual proportion in the population. In a sample of this size, one may say with 95 percent certainty that the results have a statistical precision of plus or minus 6.5 percent of what they would have been had the entire voter population been surveyed. The Rocky Mountain Poll is conducted by the Behavior Research Center of Arizona and is an independent and non-partisan research program sponsored by the Center.
