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BUSH RATINGS STABLE IN ARIZONA; McCAIN POPULARITY STILL HIGH

Phoenix, Arizona, January 17, 2003. President George W. Bush's current job approval ratings are 20 points lower than this time last year, but still remain at impressive levels – 57 percent favorable to only 18 percent unfavorable. What is more, the President's popularity, which eroded steadily over four quarters, appears to have stabilized here in Arizona, remaining basically at the same level today as was registered in October of 2002.

U.S. Senator John McCain, who will face reelection in several years, also experienced some decline in his numbers at the end of last year but, overall today, has even better ratings than does President Bush. This traces to the fact that, while Senator McCain and President Bush have identical favorable ratings (57%), McCain's negative ratings (9%) are half those of the President's. (18%).

U.S. Senator Jon Kyl's numbers are less impressive than McCain's, but principally because he remains less well known. Thus, while 22 percent of Arizonans have no opinion of Kyl, this figure is only ten percent for Senator McCain. In any event, Senator Kyl is given positive ratings by 42 percent, negative scores by only eight percent.

The findings outlined in this report are based on a survey of 675 adults across Arizona conducted between January 3rd and January 7th, 2003, by the Behavior Research Center of Arizona as part of the Center's independent and non-partisan Rocky Mountain Poll series. 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EDITOR'S NOTE: This Rocky Mountain Poll Arizona (2003-I-03) is based on 675 telephone interviews with adults across Arizona, conducted from January 3rd through January 7th, 2003. In the overall sample, one may say with 95 percent certainty that the results have a statistical precision of plus or minus 3.8 percent of what they would have been had the entire adult population been surveyed. The Rocky Mountain Poll is conducted by the Behavior Research Center of Arizona and is an independent and non-partisan research program.
