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JANET NAPOLITANO JOB RATINGS FIVE-TO-ONE FAVORABLE STATE LEGISLATURE REGAINING SOME STATURE WITH PUBLIC

Phoenix, Arizona, April 30, 2003. The Arizona State Legislature has reversed the tailspin it was in for the past half year as regards public esteem and, although current ratings are anything but stellar, there can be little doubt that the image problems created by the Alt Fuels debacle are beginning to fade in voters' minds. In both October of 2002 and January of this year, more citizens evaluated the legislature unfavorably than favorably, but today negative ratings have dropped to only 20 percent, compared to 30 percent in January. Simultaneously, those who believe the legislature is doing a good job rose to 29 from 19 percent.

Governor Janet Napolitano is well-regarded by the public, with a favorable-to-unfavorable assessment of nearly five to one (49% favorable to 10% unfavorable). The governor also enjoys bipartisan approval – 64 percent among Democrats, 44 percent among Independents and 40 percent among Republicans. Negative ratings of her performance are low: five percent among Democrats, seven among Independents and only 15 percent among Republicans. Governor Napolitano's rapport with the public is especially strong among older voters (58% positive to only 8% negative).

The findings outlined in this report are based on a survey of 700 adults across Arizona conducted between April 7th and April 10th, 2003, by the Behavior Research Center of Arizona as part of the Center's independent and non-partisan Rocky Mountain Poll series. 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EDITOR'S NOTE: This Rocky Mountain Poll Arizona (2003-I-03) is based on 700 telephone interviews with adults, conducted from April 7th through April 10th, 2003 throughout Arizona. In the overall sample, one may say with 95 percent certainty that the results have a statistical precision of plus or minus 3.8 percent of what they would have been had the entire adult population been surveyed. The Rocky Mountain Poll is conducted by the Behavior Research Center of Arizona and is an independent and non-partisan research program.
