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GOVERNOR NAPOLITANO'S JOB RATING RISES; LEGISLATURE'S JOB RATINGS UNCHANGED

Phoenix, Arizona, July 25, 2003. Governor Janet Napolitano is gaining broad-based respect among the general public and voters in Arizona for the job she is doing as Governor. Today, 55 percent rate her performance favorably, while only 15 percent say she is going a poor job as Governor. This compares to April readings of 49 percent favorable and ten percent unfavorable.

Governor Napolitano enjoys positive job ratings in all areas of the state – 58 percent in Maricopa, 58 percent in Pima and 55 percent in the rural counties – and above average readings among likely voters (58%), women (58%), Latinos (69%), Democrats (79%) and in middle and lower income families (59%).

The findings outlined in this report are based on a survey of 701 adults across Arizona conducted between July 14th and July 18th, 2003, by the Behavior Research Center of Arizona as part of the Center's independent and non-partisan Rocky Mountain Poll series. Public ratings of the state legislature remain roughly the same as in April: 30 percent favorable to 20 percent unfavorable. Of interest, however, is the fact that among likely voters, favorable ratings drop to 27 percent and unfavorable ratings rise to 26. Further, while Republican voters are more positive toward the legislature than are Democrats or Independents, favorable ratings within their ranks rise to only 32 percent while 19 percent give "poor" ratings. Respect for the legislature also tends to fall off among older voters, particularly retirees.

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EDITOR'S NOTE: This Rocky Mountain Poll Arizona (2003-III-03) is based on 701 telephone interviews with adults, conducted from July 14th through July 18th, 2003 throughout Arizona. In the overall sample, one may say with 95 percent certainty that the results have a statistical precision of plus or minus 3.8 percent of what they would have been had the entire adult population been surveyed. The Rocky Mountain Poll is conducted by the Behavior Research Center of Arizona and is an independent and non-partisan research program.
