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## BELIEF STATE HEADED IN RIGHT DIRECTION IS HOLDING STEADY

Phoenix, Arizona, October 30, 2003. Arizonans continue to believe the state is headed "in the right direction" which, for the first time this year, is running in parallel with a resurgence in confidence in the state and national economy. Today, 45 percent believe Arizona is headed in the right direction, 33 percent believe the state is seriously off track. The balance either are unsure or have mixed opinions. These readings are very similar to July.

Compared to July, belief that Arizona is headed in the right direction has surged most in Pima County, where 47 percent today, compared to 44 percent in July, say Arizona is on the right track. In July, 42 percent felt Arizona was "seriously off track," a figure that today registers only 28 percent.

The findings outlined in this report are based on a survey of 701 adults across Arizona conducted between October 9<sup>th</sup> and October 16<sup>th</sup>, 2003, by the Behavior Research Center of Arizona as part of the Center's independent and non-partisan Rocky Mountain Poll series. 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EDITOR'S NOTE: This Rocky Mountain Poll Arizona (2003-IV-07) is based on 701 telephone interviews with adults, conducted from October 9<sup>th</sup> through October 16<sup>th</sup>, 2003 throughout Arizona. In the overall sample, one may say with 95 percent certainty that the results have a statistical precision of plus or minus 3.8 percent of what they would have been had the entire adult population been surveyed. The Rocky Mountain Poll is conducted by the Behavior Research Center of Arizona and is an independent and non-partisan research program. The voter subset of this poll included 540 respondents and the margin of error for that sample is estimated to be plus or minus 4.3 percent at a .95 confidence interval.
