### AIR POLLUTION IMPACTS ON ARIZONA FAMILIES EASING IN RURAL AREAS AND PIMA COUNTY

Phoenix, Arizona, January 26, 2004. After peaking in the 1996 to 2000 period, the proportion of Arizona families reporting that one or more members of the household have suffered adverse reactions to air pollution, is lessening. Today, 45 percent say at least one member of the household suffered problems they attribute to air pollution. This is down from 46 percent last year, 47 percent in 2001 and the peak reading of 59 percent in 2000.

Family complaints about air pollution affecting the health of members of the household are highest in Maricopa County (49%) and are noticeably lower in Pima County (43%) and in the rural areas of the state (36%). The readings in rural Arizona are the lowest we have recorded since 1997 and the Maricopa readings, although currently the highest in the state, are well below the readings registered throughout most of the late 1990s.

The greatest volume of complaints come from two populous communities in Maricopa County, residents of Phoenix and residents of Tempe. The readings in Tempe are unusually strong – hitting 65 percent – and we wonder if this may trace, in part, to the number of freeways that border or bisect the community, the downtown area becoming a magnet for major regional events that draw traffic and crowds and, as well, the volume of air traffic that crosses over Tempe.

This year's survey also finds a pattern we have seen in prior years in which complaints about air pollution's adverse impacts on the family increase among younger adults and among lower income families. This may in turn trace to these groups having occupations or lifestyles that get them more involved in outdoor activities than their older or white collar counterparts.

While the decline in complaints of air pollution's impact on personal health is encouraging, the fact remains that nearly half of all families in Arizona report some problems. Further, many identify respiratory or eye impacts as more than minor inconveniences: one in five families report "major" eye irritation they believe is traceable to air pollution. Thirteen percent report "major" breathing difficulties and 17 percent report aggravation of existing lung disease such as asthma and emphysema.

The findings outlined in this report are based on a survey of 704 adults across Arizona conducted between January 6<sup>th</sup> and January 12<sup>th</sup>, 2004, by the Behavior Research Center of Arizona as part of the Center's independent and non-partisan Rocky Mountain Poll series. EDITOR'S NOTE: This Rocky Mountain Poll Arizona (2004-I-05) is based on 704 telephone interviews with adults, conducted from January 6<sup>th</sup> through January 12<sup>th</sup>, 2004 throughout Arizona. In the overall sample, one may say with 95 percent certainty that the results have a statistical precision of plus or minus 3.7 percent of what they would have been had the entire adult population been surveyed. The Rocky Mountain Poll is conducted by the Behavior Research Center of Arizona and is an independent and non-partisan research program.


