APPROVAL OF BUSH JOB PERFORMANCE HITS HISTORIC LOW IN ARIZONA. NEGATIVE RATINGS OUTPACE FAVORABLE ONES FOR FIRST TIME

Phoenix, Arizona, November 2, 2005. For the first time since assuming office, more Arizonans disapprove of the job performance of President George Bush than approve. Forty-one percent now rate his performance as "poor' compared to only 35 percent who say he is doing a good job as President.

Favorable ratings of the President have collapsed among Democrats (12%), Independents (29%), women (33%) and among older voters (33%).

The proportion of Republicans who say the President is doing a good job stands at a strong 67 percent, but the figure may not be solid when compared to the 80 percent registered among Republicans one year ago today. It also appears that women and younger voters are moving away from the President. For example, last October, 42 percent of younger voters (under 35) applauded his performance – a number that has shrunk to 30 percent today. Among women, 33 percent today give him favorable ratings compared to 49 percent one year ago.

The findings outlined in this report are based on a survey of 701 adults across Arizona conducted between October 19th and October 28th, 2005, by the Behavior Research Center of Arizona as part of the Center's independent and non-partisan Rocky Mountain Poll series. 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EDITOR'S NOTE: This Rocky Mountain Poll Arizona (2005-IV-01) is based on 701 telephone interviews with adults, conducted from October 19th through October 28th, 2005, throughout Arizona. In the overall sample, one may say with 95 percent certainty that the results have a statistical precision of plus or minus 3.7 percent of what they would have been had the entire adult population been surveyed. The Rocky Mountain Poll is conducted by the Behavior Research Center of Arizona and is an independent and non-partisan research program.
