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## NAPOLITANO MOST POPULAR STATEWIDE OFFICE-HOLDER

Phoenix, Arizona, August 21, 2007. Governor Janet Napolitano is by far the most popular statewide elected official in Arizona, with 59 percent of Arizona voters feeling she is doing a good job in office and just nine percent rating her performance in office as poor. The negative rating is the lowest for the Governor since taking office.

The Governor's positive job approval crosses party lines, with 76 percent of Democrats, 51 percent of Independents and even 41 percent of Republicans giving her positive marks for her handling of the job. Just 13 percent of Republicans and 11 percent of Independents rate her job performance negatively.

Moreover, in a test election for U.S. Senate against incumbent Republican icon John McCain, Napolitano bests McCain by eleven points (47% to 36%), gathering the votes of 78 percent of Democrats, 47 percent of Independents and 20 percent of Republicans.

This report is based on a survey of 629 interviews with voters across Arizona, conducted between July 27<sup>th</sup> and August 4<sup>th</sup>, 2007 by the Behavior Research Center of Arizona as part of the Center's independent and non-partisan Rocky Mountain Poll series. EDITOR'S NOTE: This Rocky Mountain Poll - Arizona (2007-IV-03), is based on 629 interviews with voters across Arizona, conducted between July 27<sup>th</sup> and August 4<sup>th</sup> 2007. Where necessary, figures for age, sex, race and political party were weighted to bring them into line with their actual proportion in the population. In a sample of this size, one can say with a 95 percent certainty that the results have a statistical precision of plus or minus 3.9 percent of what they would have been had the entire voter population been surveyed. The Rocky Mountain Poll is conducted by the Behavior Research Center of Arizona and is an independent and non-partisan research program sponsored by the Center.
