CONFIDENCE IN ARIZONA'S TWO U.S. SENATORS IMPROVES SLIGHTLY, BUT IS STILL BELOW PAST LEVELS AS VOTERS REMAIN UNHAPPY WITH CONGRESS

Phoenix, Arizona. January 27, 2011. Voter respect for the work being done in the U.S. Senate by retiring U.S. Senator Jon Kyl and Senior Senator John McCain is experiencing a mild renaissance although both men's ratings remain at levels significantly lower than in past years. The reluctance of voters to give their Senators premium marks may trace in large measure to voters' dissatisfaction with the 112th Congress. Currently, 53 percent rate this Congress as doing a poor job. Favorable job ratings for Senator Kyl rose to 33 percent in January from 24 percent last spring. His negative job ratings declined as well from 23 percent to 20 percent. In years past, however, Senator Kyl has enjoyed positive scores of over 50 percent and negatives as low as five percent (January 2002).

Senator John McCain also has the most favorable job ratings he has enjoyed since July of 2010 when favorable ratings were 36 percent compared to 39 percent today. Unlike Senator Kyl, however, Senator McCain's negative job assessment rests at 26 percent, only two points lower than last April and the third highest negative rating since we began testing his approval scores 20 years ago. In January 2005, six percent of the Arizona electorate thought Senator McCain was doing a poor job in Washington, but today that number is 26 percent. Senator McCain's ratings rose to 73 percent in January 2005, his highest on record.

Part of the reason for the current improvements in McCain's evaluation by voters traces to the views of registered Independents – 44 percent of whom today rate him favorably compared to only 25 percent in April of 2011. Democrats and Republicans views have remained fundamentally unchanged during this period with Republicans applauding his work at a four to one ratio and Democrats giving him a thumbs down by a ratio of exactly two to one.

EDITOR'S NOTE: This Rocky Mountain Poll - Arizona (2012-I-06), is based on 553 interviews with registered voters statewide, conducted between January 5th and 9th. Interviewing was conducted in both English and Spanish by professional interviewers of the Behavior Research Center on both landlines and cell phones. Where necessary, figures for age, sex, race and political party were weighted to bring them into line with their actual proportion in the population. In a sample of this size, one can say with a 95 percent certainty that the results have a statistical precision of plus or minus 4.3 percent of what they would have been had the entire adult population been surveyed. The Rocky Mountain Poll is conducted by the Behavior Research Center of Arizona and is an independent and non-partisan research program sponsored by the Center.
